## What is the Programme

### Their dreams need your support!?

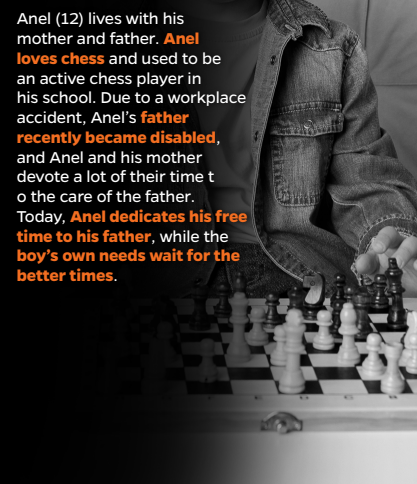
Their dreams need your support is a programme that provides holistic assistance to the most vulnerable children. It allows individuals and companies to be actively involved in the lives of children who dream of a better future amidst poverty. The programme asks individuals and companies to provide a monthly allowance for the most vulnerable children. The World Vision staff supports children and parents in creating a development plan for a child, monitor progress and administer the programme.

### Who are boys and girls receiving financial assistance!?

Children included in the project live in generational poverty. Their parents/guardians do not have a steady income and struggle to afford food, appropriate clothes, school supplies, and transportation to school. Vulnerability, however, is not just a lack of food and basic life necessities. These children are often excluded from extracurricular activities and have no other opportunities to explore their talents and aspirations. Their life skills are underdeveloped; they often suffer from speech impediments, are unable to articulate their thoughts and they struggle with forming relationships. Poverty and exclusion complicate access to health care, education and other services.



Marko (10) lives with a single mother and two siblings. Marko is a responsible boy and finishes schoolwork on time, but he **invests the most energy and effort in sports, especially football, and keeps getting better.** Marko's mother tries to provide everything needed for a healthy and happy childhood for all, but the **costs of education, training and equipment are increasing.**



### The financial assistance can be used for:

- satisfying child's basic needs, such as hygiene supplies and school lunch, transport to school, clothes and shoes, school supplies and textbooks;
- developing life skills and talents, such as science, IT and language lessons, music, art and sports, field trips, summer camps and other activities that promote the development of life skills.

### Who can become a Guardian of children's dreams!?

All individuals and companies who are interested in providing financial support to the most vulnerable children can become Guardians of children's dreams. Guardians can contribute:

- full allowance of 95 BAM per month for the support of one vulnerable child,
- partial allowance in any amount higher than 20 BAM. In this case, World Vision combines the allocated funds to reach minimum monthly support.
- Full allowance paid by multiple people who self-organise and decide on their representative.

Guardians can support as many children as their finances allow.

### How do you become a Guardian!?

With the first donation, you initiate a change in the life of one child and become a Guardian of children's dreams. Donate via [www.worldvision.ba](http://www.worldvision.ba), or send a query via email and get in touch with the World Vision BiH staff who will provide you additional information about the programme, children who need support and their needs.

### What happens after I become a Guardian!?

Individuals who decide to provide long-term support to children sign the Agreement which defines the obligations of World Vision BiH towards the donor and the supported child. Once the Agreement is signed staff visits the vulnerable child and their family and signs the Agreement with their parents/guardians.

The Agreement stipulates the creation of a Four-month intervention plan (CIP), which describes the priority needs of the child. World Vision BiH staff support the child and their caretakers in making this plan and ensure that the financial assistance goes towards the child's needs.

The donor can terminate the agreement at any time.

### How long am I obligated to provide support!?

Knowing that the act of giving and donating comes from the heart, we want to keep it that way. We are grateful for the support you give and welcome it as long as you can provide it. Only you can determine the duration of your engagement as a Guardian of children's dreams. If you choose so, you can leave the Their Dreams Need Your Support program at any time.

### How can I make payments?

Whether you choose to allocate the full or partial monthly allowance, we want the payment process to be as simple as possible. There are several ways to make payments, and you can choose the one that suits you best:

1. Make an electronic payment on our official website [www.worldvision.ba](http://www.worldvision.ba);
2. Pay to our account in Raiffeisen Bank dd Sarajevo. The transactions should be made to the bank account of World Vision International in Bosnia and Herzegovina: 16100000000000011, reference 030001416-4.
3. Open a permanent account in your home bank and assign a monthly amount,
4. Call our unique humanitarian number **17024** and make a 2 BAM contribution.

(The service is available for users of three operators - BH Telecom, Eronet and M.tel.)

### Why engage with World Vision?

World Vision has been working in BiH since 1994, contributing to positive changes in the lives of more than 20,000 children annually. Our thirty years of experience in the field generates detailed knowledge of the needs of the BiH population. Partnerships with local institutions and organizations such as centers for social work and schools ensure that we have timely insight into the needs of children.

Rada (14) is the oldest of **five children.** She **loves art** and participates in school art exhibitions. However, due to family circumstances, **she doesn't have the opportunity to develop her talent.** Income in Rada's family comes from daily wages that her father earns through physical labour and can seldom cover the basic needs of all children. Rada, also, allocates a lot of her time to help **siblings who struggle with developmental difficulties.**

Edin (14) **lives with his father** and **sees his mother only occasionally.** He is a 9th-grade student whose teachers testify that **he needs support in learning.** Edin **does not have a family member who could help him achieve better success** in school and achieve his dreams. And Edin's father cannot afford to pay for help. His father works as a mason during the construction season, but **they have no steady income.**



"Water doesn't get into my boots anymore," says one of the boys **involved in our stipend program,** who **walks to school** every day.



**Walking on her own** was a dream of Ajla (12). She has difficulties moving and needs **appropriate corrective footwear, which is very expensive.** **With the support of her Guardian,** a member of the program Their Dreams Need Your Support, Ajla was able to afford the orthopaedic shoes. Now, **she walks to school on her own** and spends time with friends.
